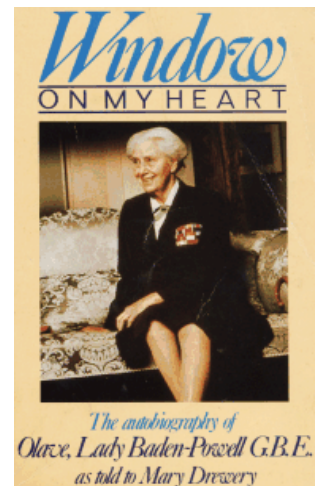

 Mrs Ann Millhouse, Chief Commissioner for Australia. (-1992)
 Mrs Dorothy Woolley State Commissioner for Victoria
 Northern Territory became an Autonomous Guiding State with Mrs Lyn Mounsey as State Commissioner. She had voting rights at National Executives
 Victorian Guiding started 'Greening Victoria' as a Bicentenary project. Members worked with farmers. and other service clubs to plant thousands of trees throughout the state.
 'Porepunka' International Camp held in N.S.W. at Easter. (Meaning 'The meetings of the waters.' - they were near washed out !)



1989

Victorian Guiding held a special Thinking Day at the Myer Music Bowl for the Anniversary of the birth of Olave Baden-Powell



Olave House London closed. (To be replaced by 'Pax Lodge'- due to be officially opened in 1991)
 Alan Rawady (husband of Helen- outdoors activities adviser for Victoria) designed the winning entry for the Pax Lodge logo
 With the breaking-down of the 'Wall', Western European countries brought guiding out into the open. World Guiding was there to help in their re-organising. Many had been operating in secret against the government orders and threatened jail for doing so.
 Victoria hosted the Olave Baden-Powell Society Presentation. Princess Benedikte of Denmark attended 21st Birthday celebration at 20 Russell St
